Aleppo, the third largest city in the Ottoman Empire after Istanbul and Cairo in the 17th century, has also been an important Christian city, with Christians making up a quarter of its population as late as 1960. The case of Aleppo offers us the opportunity to examine what it meant to be a Christian in an Islamic surrounding. Furthermore, between the 17th and 19th centuries Aleppo underwent a major cultural shift, which prepared the so-called Nahda, the Arabic Renaissance. This was made possible because Aleppo and the Christians of the city have been on the crossroads of different cultures.
